The Wine Advocate rewards the innovative effort of Remírez de Ganuza.

The prestigious American magazine, *The Wine Advocate*, published by Robert Parker, has awarded the **Ramírez de Ganuza Gran Reserva**, vintage **2004**, a score of 100 points, the highest possible rating given by the publication. This rating rewards the strong commitment of the winery over many years to long ageing in new cask. In fact, this is the first Gran Reserva to achieve the Parker 100 points.

The investment undertaken by Fernando Remírez de Ganuza in research and development has also been recognised with 98 points being awarded to **Trasnocho**. This wine, featuring a unique system of extraction developed over a 10 year period, was tasted by the Robert Parker team last month although it is not yet available in stores in the US.

In the review of Remírez de Ganuza wines, Jay Miller tasted again the **Reserva 2004** and raised its score from 96 to 97 points. The **Reserva 2001** rating increased from 94 to 97 Parker points. The cellar's wines continue to evidence a great evolution in the bottle, the result of a long painstaking ageing in new cask.

Fernando Remírez de Ganuza intends to continue experimenting and innovating, and, since the 2008 vintage has a new section of the selection table that washes the grape with its own juice. This section is to be improved, thereby optimizing its performance for the coming harvest.
